Department Head Reports

Veterans & Human Services Director Michael Holzhauser said the Welfare Officials' Spring Workshop, which focused on mental health concerns, went very well. Holzhauser updated the board on the number of phone calls the office has made and received, and the number of in-person meetings. He said rent requests have decreased.

Pierce asked Holzhauser about the state collection process regarding county liens. She asked Holzhauser if his office is keeping track of that data. Holzhauser said Veterans & Human Services Deputy Director Irene Pierce has been collecting that data. Pierce said she has heard that the process has not been running smoothly, and asked Holzhauser if he would reach out to the state collection agency that has taken over some of the collection duties.

County Development Director Robert Hill said the Brush Lake recovery mission has been completed. Hill thanked every entity that was involved; the US Fish and Wildlife Service, US National Weather Service, South Dakota Department of Game Fish & Parks, Brookings County Sheriff's Department, Brookings County Search & Rescue Dog Team, Commissioner Larry Jensen, Brookings County Emergency Management, Codington County Search & Rescue, Codington County Emergency Management, Kingsbury County Sheriff's Department, Arlington Fire Department, Aurora Fire Department, Brookings Fire Department, Elkton Fire Department member Arend Schuurman, Lake Preston Fire Department, Lake Preston Ambulance Department, Volga Fire Department, American Red Cross, private helicopter owner Wes Brown, the dog search person from Moorhead/Bismarck, Clark Police Department, friends, and family members.

Hill attended and discussed the NACo's Legislative Conference; attended a Public Safety WMD Class; attended a SDOEM Region VI Meeting in Mitchell regarding Homeland Security Grants; and attended an ICS Training. Hill said the American Red Cross is going to do a smoke alarm installation day on May $20^{\rm th}$.

Hill said he had a discussion over coffee between neighbors and representatives of the Gun Club; he said that meeting went very well. Hill also said County Development Director Richard Haugen and GIS Technician Jim Sampson visited the wind farms and discussed addressing issues. Hill discussed upcoming dates with the board.

Finance Officer Vicki Buseth said the City/School election is April 11th.

Be it noted, Finance Officer Vicki Buseth presented the 2017 Investment Policy Monies and Transfers to the board.

Be it noted, Finance Assistant II Jenna Peterson discussed the 2017 public surplus sale with the board. Peterson said the sale brought in \$15,710.50.

Sheriff Martin Stanwick said there were 34 book-ins over Pub Crawl weekend and three emergency committals. Stanwick attended and discussed the Brookings Empowerment Meeting.

Highway Superintendent Richard Birk said he attended the Annual Township Meeting. Birk asked the board for permission to remove the weight limit restrictions on County Road 21, from 215th Street south to State Highway 324, to allow trucks to go south rather than north through the construction going on at 6th Street. Miller said if Birk thinks it is okay to remove the weight restrictions, then go ahead. By consensus, the board gave Birk permission to remove those weight restrictions on that portion of County Road 21.

Birk said the bridge north of Bruce is moving forward. He said his crew has been busy crack-filling and filling pot holes. Birk said they've been having problems with the crack-filling machine so they are looking at renting one for the rest of the season.

SCHEDULED AGENDA ITEM

As scheduled at 9:30 a.m., States Attorney Abigail Howard and Chief Deputy States Attorney Teree Nesvold presented the 2016 Annual State's Attorney's Statistics Report.

Chairperson Jensen declared a five minute recess.

SCHEDULED AGENDA ITEM

As scheduled at 10:00 a.m., Jack Otta with the Lake Sinai Association discussed a possible schedule on cleaning out the right-of-way under County Road 11 on the east side of Lake Sinai.

Otta said there are cattails, debris, soil sediment and logs blocking the inlet and outlet flow of the culvert. Otta said he is disappointed with the unwillingness from the county to get the job done.

Brookings County resident Dave Tvedt said there are cattails and residue drifting in the water, along with sediment in the culverts and animal traffic. Otta said these culverts need frequent observation and maintenance; it is the county's legal obligation to maintain it at its very lowest level. Otta said he would like something in writing from the board to ensure it gets done.

Miller asked Weed Supervisor Misty Moser if she sprayed last year when there was no water. Moser said she did spray when there was no water, but a permit is required if you want to spray in the water. Miller said there must have been a misunderstanding on whether or not the county could get a permit to spray in the water.

Area Fisheries Supervisor for Southeastern South Dakota Todd St. Sauver said he is responsible for aquatic habitat and access work. He said he did not fully understand the location at which Moser and Otta were talking about at the time of the issue. Now that he fully understands the location, Saintsobber said he does not believe a permit is required to spray in the water.

Highway Superintendent Richard Birk said he can try and make a point to clean the culvert out. Commissioner Pierce suggested that Moser spray on a regular schedule and have someone else take a look at the sediment. Commissioner Miller said there was a miscommunication between all parties; the county should be able to clean it up.

Commissioner Jensen said the county needs to make a conscience effort to keep the culverts clear.

Motion to amend the main motion by Pierce, seconded by Krogman to change the word "police" to "law enforcement" in the first paragraph; change the word "age" to "ages" in the second paragraph; and to amend the fifth paragraph to read "Whereas, Brookings County support the elimination of violence and harassment against all people. The County further recognizes women and minorities have a higher risk of being victims of such acts and is committed to providing services, education, culturally competent law enforcement practices, and governance for the prevention of crimes against women and minorities; and".

Roll call vote on the amendment: Miller "aye," Krogman "aye," Bartley "aye," Pierce "aye," Jensen "aye." Amendment carried.

Roll call vote on the main motion as amended: Krogman "aye," Bartley "aye," Pierce "aye," Miller "aye," Jensen "aye." Main motion as amended carried.

Sheriff Martin Stanwick said he will assign a LGBTQ liaison within his department.

Resolution #17-08

A Resolution Reaffirming Brookings County's Values of Inclusion, Respect, Tolerance, Equality and Justice, and the County's Commitment Toward Action to Reinforce These Values

WHEREAS, accounts of incidents of hate targeted at Muslim, Sikh, Arab, Jewish, Latino, African-American, Asian, Native-American, female, people with disabilities, immigrant, refugee, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and other high risk community members have been reported to law enforcement, on social media, and to advocacy organizations across the nation; and

WHEREAS, many in our county are hurting and fearful as a result of the rise of a rhetoric of exclusion and vilification; and

WHEREAS, the Brookings County draws strength from the diversity of its residents' ages; ethnicity; gender; gender identity; language; nationality; physical, mental, and developmental abilities; race; religion; sexual orientation; skin color; socio-economic status; political ideology; and perspective; and

WHEREAS, Brookings County appoints a member to the City of Brookings' Human Rights Commission whose mission is to improve human relations in the Brookings area by fighting discrimination through education and a complaint resolution procedure; and

WHEREAS, Brookings County supports the elimination of violence and harassment against all people. The County further recognizes women and minorities have a higher risk of being victims of such acts and is committed to providing services, education, culturally competent law enforcement practices, and governance for the prevention of crimes against women and minorities; and

WHEREAS, Brookings County supports the peaceful exercise of free speech and assembly for all people.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Brookings County that:

Section 1. Brookings County will continue to be an inclusive county that treats everyone with dignity and respect, and affirms and celebrates its mosaic of diverse residents and visitors.

Section 2. Brookings County reaffirms its commitment to uphold justice, provide equality of opportunity for all, actively encourage all voices to be heard, promote inclusion, and oppose acts of intolerance or discrimination.

Section 3. Brookings County will implement measures to facilitate reporting, tracking, and responding to hate and bias-motivated activities in the county.

RESOLTUION #17-11

A BRIDGE INSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH THE SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, *United States Code* and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, *Code of Federal Regulations*, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, Brookings County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The County requests SDDOT to hire Banner Associates, Inc. (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the County for 20% of the cost. The County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

Miller said Lake County adopted a resolution and wondered if Brookings County should also adopt a resolution for the County Site Analysis Program Phase II.

By consensus, the board agreed to move forward with creating a resolution, similar to Lake County's resolution, and will schedule action at the next meeting.

Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen presented the Commission Department Director's Report.

Steffensen said Tom Grimmond with Dougherty & Company suggested that the board hire bond counsel. Steffensen said Todd Meierhenry has worked for Brookings County in the past and is Grimmond's recommendation. By consensus, the board agreed to let Steffensen contact Mr. Meierhenry.

Steffensen discussed creating an ordinance for the county-owned parking lot by the 1921 building with the board.
