### *Department Head Reports*

County Development Director Robert Hill attended a Big Sioux River Basin Stakeholder meeting in Sioux Falls. Hill also attended hands-on training for CBRNE Incidents and Incident Commander (IC): Capabilities, Planning and Response Actions for All Hazards in Anniston, Alabama. Hill said County Development Deputy Director Richard Haugen attended the monthly PPCC/POD meeting. On November 14<sup>th</sup>, Hill met with Northwestern Energy in Huron to discuss possible training/exercises. He also attended a DOT/HP Winter Coordination meeting at the SDDOT Brookings Office.

Director of Equalization Chris Lilla discussed an owner occupied application with the board. Lilla said the audit is scheduled for November 29<sup>th</sup>. He also said they are finishing up the building permit season.

Finance Officer Vicki Buseth said they will begin the surplus sale process, and asked if the items could be sold online again. By consensus, the board agreed to move forward with the online public surplus sale.

Buseth said they've mailed out delinquent notices.

Buseth said State Auditors are here to start the audit and will be in the conference room between the Finance Office and Equalization Office.

Buseth thanked IT Specialist Shawn Plowman, County Commission Director Stacy Steffensen, and the Highway Department for their assistance with the General Election. Buseth said the election process went very smooth. Krogman said he heard nothing but positive feedback.

Highway Superintendent Richard Birk said they've started the bridge project north of Bruce. He said a portion of Highway 7 will be closed.

Birk said the finishing touches are being done on the Sinai Shop.

Birk said the bridge on Highway 6 has markings on it because they are testing the surface to see what extent of the work will have to be done.

Birk said they are preparing the equipment and testing it for winter.

Birk said he will be meeting with an insurance adjuster to finish up the fire damage claim for the Quonset buildings.

Birk said the man holes on 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue are being addressed.

Veterans & Human Service Director Michael Holzhauser thanked the commissioners for presenting the Korean Ambassador for Peace Medals to the Korean War veterans.

Holzhauser attended the Brookings Chamber of Commerce Veterans Affairs Meeting; attended the Salvation Army Meeting; attended a DAV Meeting; and attended a County Legion Meeting in White. Holzhauser said he gave a presentation at the new Lions Club.

### **DRAINAGE BOARD MEETING**

Motion by Miller, seconded by Yseth to recess as the Brookings County Board of County Commissioners and convened as the Brookings County Drainage Board, in accordance with SDCL 46A-10A-4.

Roll call vote: Yseth “aye,” Miller “aye,” Jensen “aye,” Krogman “aye.” Motion carried.

County Development Director Robert Hill said the drainage board is required to meet twice a year. Hill discussed information he received at the Big Sioux River Basin Stakeholder meeting in Sioux Falls.

Motion by Yseth, seconded by Jensen to reconvene as the Brookings County Board of County Commissioners.

Roll call vote: Miller “aye,” Jensen “aye,” Yseth “aye,” Krogman “aye.” Motion carried.

### **REGULAR BUSINESS CONTINUED**

Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen presented the Commission Department Director’s Report.

Steffensen shared Pennington County’s policy for volunteer board appointments with the board. Steffensen asked the board if they want a similar policy for Brookings County.

Steffensen said she updated the 2017 County Commission calendar. Steffensen said Brookings Day at the Capitol is set for January 18, 2017.

Steffensen discussed additional upcoming dates.

Steffensen said she was asked to have the board look at the gym reimbursement policy. She said it hasn’t changed for a number of years. Steffensen said they will be doing a complete revision with multiple changes to the employee handbook, and if the board wants to change the gym reimbursement amount to do that during the revision. Miller asked if someone thinks they needed to change it. Steffensen said they would like to see the reimbursement increase due to the increase in gym memberships. Jensen asked if the board should change it to a percentage rather than a dollar amount. Miller said she would like to think about it.

Commissioner Yseth asked to discuss the volunteer board appointments. Chief Deputy States Attorney Abigail Howard said at the end of the day, the board is still picking volunteers that would best serve on the board and that having a similar policy to Pennington County doesn’t deviate from that concept. Howard said her recommendation is to just vet the individuals who are applying, have those conversations at the public session, and even have them come in and visit.

Steffensen said the board has made appointments for 2017 already and that the board should not change their process for the remaining appointments.

Miller said commissioners are elected officials and board appointments are public; they have to make tough decisions. Miller said she doesn't believe Brookings County needs a policy. Jensen said his concern is not so much the policy, but rather the process of selecting board appointments; who is going to be first and who is going to be last on the agenda. As Chairman, Krogman said that is something he will need to figure out. Steffensen said the order on the agenda had nothing to do with their qualifications.

By consensus, the board agreed to not make a volunteer board appointment policy for Brookings County.

Chief Deputy States Attorney Abigail Howard said Marsy's Law passed, which means the States Attorney's Office will be very busy.

Because of the new transition beginning January 1, 2017, Howard said they will be hiring another attorney. She asked the board if that attorney could start the middle of December to make the transition easier. Yseth said if it's that important, why wait until January 1<sup>st</sup>. Krogman said it has been over forty years since they had a change in the office and has no problem with starting the attorney early.
