

ORDINANCE NO. 94-3

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY THEREFORE.

WHEREAS the running of dogs at large is dangerous to both livestock and people; and

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners is empowered by SDCL 40-34-5 to regulate, restrain or prohibit the running at large of dogs; and

WHEREAS the Brookings County Board of County Commissioners deems it necessary, for the purpose of promoting the health, safety and the general welfare of the community to prohibit the running at large of dogs;


THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY BROOKINGS COUNTY That, pursuant to SDCL 40-34-5, any person owning or keeping a dog or dogs who fails to restrain such dog or dogs and thereby permits such dog or dogs to run at large shall be guilty of a crime and that the penalty for each violation thereof shall be a fine of not to exceed Two Hundred and No/100ths (\$200.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in a county jail for a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith are hereby repealed.
