Department Head Reports

County Development Director Robert Hill said a storm system will be moving into the area later in the afternoon. Hill said the FEMA declaration was approved for public assistance. He said there will be a meeting on July 19th at 2:00 p.m. at the east fire station.

Highway Superintendent Brian Gustad said they finished up the asphalt on the Sinai bridge. Gustad said he's hoping the guardrail is installed later this week so they can open it.

Gustad said they started work on the shop roof and hopes the shop roof will be completed later in the week.

Sheriff Marty Stanwick said there are 23 inmates in jail, 3 inmates from Lake County and 3 inmates from Moody County. Stanwick said there are 115 individuals participating on the 24/7 program.

Stanwick said he's looking forward to phase 2 of the remodel project being completed. Stanwick said his staff stayed busy over the 4th of July with traffic type offenses and domestics.

RESOLUTION #22-25

A Resolution Establishing a Discretionary Formula for
Reduced Taxation of New Commercial Residential Structures and
Additions in the County of Brookings, South Dakota and
Amending Resolution #20-34

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to SDCL 10-6-137 (5), the County of Brookings, South Dakota, hereby establishes the following discretionary formula for reduced taxation of new commercial residential structures and additions, containing four or more units:

- 1) For seven (7) years following construction, all new commercial residential structures, or additions to existing structures, containing four or more units, which have a full and true value of thirty (30) thousand dollars or more, added to real property shall be assessed as follows:
 - a. First year following construction, 25% of full and true value;

- b. Second year following construction, 25% of full and true value;
 - c. Third year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - d. Fourth year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - e. Fifth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - f. Sixth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - g. Seventh year following construction, 100% of full and true value.
- 2) Any structure that is partially constructed on the assessment date shall be assessed using the same percentage as used for completed construction as set forth in this resolution.
- 3) The Board of County Commissioners may, if requested by the owner of any of the above-described property, not apply the above formula, in which case the full assessment shall be made without application of the formula. In waiving this formula for the structure of one owner, the Board of County Commissioners is not prohibited from applying the formula for subsequent new structures by that owner.
- 4) The assessed valuation during any of the seven years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction.
- 5) All resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

RESOLUTION #22-26

A Resolution Establishing a Discretionary Formula for
Reduced Taxation of New Housing Structures, Located Within a
Redevelopment Neighborhood, in the
County of Brookings, South Dakota

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to SDCL 10-6-137 (7), the County of Brookings, South Dakota, hereby establishes the following discretionary formula for reduced taxation of any new residential structure, or addition to or renovation of an existing structure, located within a redevelopment neighborhood established pursuant to SDCL § 10-6-141 if the new structure, addition, or renovation has a full and true value of five thousand dollars or more. The structure shall be located in an area defined and designated as a redevelopment neighborhood based on conditions provided in SDCL § 11-7-2 or 11-7-3

- 1) For seven (7) years following construction, all new housing structures, located within a redevelopment neighborhood, which have a full and true value of five (5) thousand dollars or more, added to real property shall be assessed as follows:
 - a. First year following construction, 25% of full and true value;
 - b. Second year following construction, 25% of full and true value;
 - c. Third year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - d. Fourth year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - e. Fifth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - f. Sixth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - g. Seventh year following construction, 100% of full and true value.
- 2) Any structure that is partially constructed on the assessment date shall be assessed using the same percentage as used for completed construction as set forth in this resolution.
- 3) The Board of County Commissioners may, if requested by the owner of any of the above-described property, not apply the above formula, in which case the full assessment shall be made without application of the formula. In waiving this formula for the structure of one owner, the Board of County Commissioners is not prohibited from applying the formula for subsequent new structures by that owner.
- 4) The assessed valuation during any of the seven years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction.

RESOLUTION #22-27

A Resolution Establishing a Discretionary Formula for Reduced Taxation of New Affordable Housing Structures in the County of Brookings, South Dakota

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to SDCL 10-6-137 (6), the County of Brookings, South Dakota, hereby establishes the following discretionary formula for reduced taxation of new affordable housing structures containing four or more units, with a monthly rental rate of the units at or below the annually calculated rent for the state's sixty percent area median income being used by the South Dakota Housing Development Authority for a minimum of ten years following the date of first occupancy, if the structure has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more:

- 1) For seven (7) years following construction, all new affordable housing structures, which have a full and true value of thirty (30) thousand dollars or more, added to real property shall be assessed as follows:
 - a. First year following construction, 25% of full and true value;
 - b. Second year following construction, 25% of full and true value;
 - c. Third year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - d. Fourth year following construction, 50% of full and true value;
 - e. Fifth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - f. Sixth year following construction, 75% of full and true value;
 - g. Seventh year following construction, 100% of full and true value.
- 2) Any structure that is partially constructed on the assessment date shall be assessed using the same percentage as used for completed construction as set forth in this resolution.
- 3) The Board of County Commissioners may, if requested by the owner of any of the above-described property, not apply the above formula, in which case the full assessment shall be made without application of the formula. In waiving this formula for the structure of one owner, the Board of County Commissioners is not prohibited from applying the formula for subsequent new structures by that owner.
- 4) The assessed valuation during any of the seven years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction.

Background information was provided by Highway Superintendent Brian Gustad.

Motion by Pierce, seconded by Jensen to remove the approval of the Brookings County Housing Study from the table. All members voted “aye.” Motion carried.

Motion by Bartley, seconded by Jensen to approve the Brookings County Housing Study was made at the June 21, 2022, meeting.

Pierce said she was disappointed in the housing study. She said the lack of depth as relates to the county and joint jurisdiction area wasn’t helpful. Pierce said this will be cited in different things that happen over the next 10 years. She said it doesn’t address the needs in the joint jurisdiction area or the smaller communities.

Krogman said he wanted more or different ideas on how to help with housing. He said they can acknowledge receipt of the housing study. Boersma said if the board is not satisfied with what came out of the study, they need to respond back. She said they used taxpayer dollars to help fund this study.

Jensen said he was hoping there would be more direction for the smaller communities. Bartley said the study didn’t tell him anything he didn’t already suspect or know. He said it didn’t really give any direction.

Motion by Pierce, seconded by Bartley to amend the motion to acknowledge receipt of the housing study. All members voted “aye.” Amendment carried. Boersma said she and Commissioner Krogman will go back to RDG and see if they can get more information. Voice vote on main motion as amended - all members voted “aye.”

The board reviewed the FY2023 draft provisional budget.

Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen presented the Commission Department Director's Report. Steffensen discussed resolutions and the SDACC fall convention. She said if

anyone has any ideas on resolutions they want to pass locally and send to the SDACC fall convention for approval, she needs it by the end of the month.

Pierce said they received a negative decision on an unemployment insurance claim. Pierce said when you look at unemployment insurance, you have employers who pay into that insurance fund, and you have employers who don't pay in but reimburse a department for anything that's paid out. Pierce said Brookings County doesn't pay in but reimburses. She said there's a dozen exemptions for collecting unemployment benefits, but all of those exemptions don't apply to any entity that elects to be a reimbursing employer.

Pierce said the board may want to submit a resolution that would eliminate that type of statute. She said employers who reimburse should be entitled to the same exemptions. Boersma said it's worth exploring. Steffensen said they'll need to approve a resolution by the next meeting. Steffensen discussed upcoming dates.

States Attorney Dan Nelson had nothing to report.

Commissioner Krogman attended a Growth Partnership Meeting and attended the budget hearings.
